Meet the colours, materials, shapes and features defining the heart of the home in 2025 and beyond – everything from glass and steel to murals and rosy hues



SOFT GEOMETRY

Sitting between rounded shapes and angular lines, and drawing on elements of both, this kitchen island by Sydney-based Studio Johnston features a rectangular block with radial edges. It makes the case for a new kind of shapely trend: that of soft geometry, designs with interesting angles that are smoothed at the corners. Bizanto quartzite worktop, Artedomus. RECESSED HANDLES

MOODY SHAKER

We are captivated by the moody tones of this deVOL kitchen. It signals a turn back towards darker kitchens, but with a caveat: this time it's not navy. Instead, we're talking deep greens and reds, marble with dramatic dark veining, charred timber and darkened metal finishes. And crucially, it's all balanced by lighter touches - here, it's the white of the worktop, but also the floaty cafe-style curtain under the sink, and the brass details that give the whole scheme a shiny metallic lift.
